Motion 1. BOVAIRD/ LEWIS

WHEREAS eligibility rules such as transfers, age requirements, etc. should be applied equally in all associations that wish to be EOSSAA members and who plan on qualifying teams to EOSSAA championships;

AND WHEREAS when associations do not follow EOSSAA eligibility rules, it can result in unfair recruitment of student-athletes;

AND WHEREAS the use of ineligible players causes problems with seeding in some sports;

AND WHEREAS teams are being eliminated by other teams using ineligible players;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the following be added as "(c)" to By-law 5, Section 3:

EOSSAA Championships or Festivals for team sports shall only involve teams which have used EOSSAA-eligible student-athletes in all competition during the school year. EOSSAA-eligible means the student meets all eligibility requirements as defined in the EOSSAA playing regulations and the EOSSAA by-laws. Any team using an ineligible student-athlete(s) in any competition during the school year forfeits the right to participate in the EOSSAA Championship or Festival.

Notes:

1. The term "competition" does not exclusively refer to league play; it is defined as anytime two teams play against each other on a playing surface, whether in Ontario or elsewhere.

2. The requirement that only EOSSAA-eligible athletes be used in all competition applies solely to teams qualifying for EOSSAA Championships or Festivals. This does not apply to teams in leagues that do not send teams to EOSSAA Championships or Festivals unless otherwise stated by the local or regional high school athletic body of which the school is a member.

uses...Classification Committee. For all Championships coordinated by E.O.S.S.A.A., schools shall be classified as follows: 'A', 'AA', 'AAA'

"A" - Schools with a student population of 500 or fewer

"AA" - Schools with a student population from 501-950

"AAA" - Schools with a student population from 951+

Boys' Basketball, Page : 8, Section 9 Rules and Officials

Girls' Basketball, Page: 8, Section 9, Rules and Officials

FIBA Motion

WHEREAS there has been interest expressed from teacher-coaches to move to a consistent set of basketball rules as currently Federation and FIBA rules are used for game play in Ontario.

AND WHEREAS moving to one set of rules will allow for greater consistency among officials, coaches, and players.

AND WHEREAS there is an understanding of the challenges involved with changing floor markings, game length and changing uniform numbers.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Beginning in September 2016, OFSAA adopt the FIBA playing regulations for both the boys and girls basketball with the following modifications:

For the Boys Basketball Playing Regulations, Section 9 – Rules and Officials, the sentence "The current National Federation Rule

Book..." be replaced with "The current FIBA Rule book shall be the official governing rule book governing play at the EOSSAA

Basketball Championships with the following exceptions:"

1) A 35 second shot clock will be used. Full reset on foul shot attempts and shots off the rim.

2) Fouls and Offensive rebounds would result in 35 second reset.

- 3) Federation lines will be used even when FIBA lines are available
- 4) Federation game length will be used (including overtime)
- 5) No dunking in the warm-up will be permitted (technical foul (s) assessed to player (s))
- 6) Federation time out procedure will be used.

For the Girls Basketball Playing Regulations, Section 9 – Rules and Officials be replaced with "The current FIBA Rule Book shall be the official governing rulebook governing play at the EOSSAA Basketball Championships with the following exceptions:

1) A 35 second shot clock will be used. Full reset on foul shot attempts and shots off the rim. 2) Fouls and Offensive rebounds would result in 35 second reset.

3) Federation lines will be used even when FIBA lines are available

- 4) Federation game length will be used (including overtime)
- 5) No dunking in the warm-up will be permitted (technical foul (s) assessed to player (s))
- 6) Federation time out procedure will be used.
